

On Mary's birthday (Jesus' mom), we prayed the Rosary and had a party in our new reading room.

We studied St. Paul's *Letter to the Philippians* in a 6-week program by Dr. Tim Gray.

October The Blessing of Animals on the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi was held in the town square with our

protestant brothers and sisters.

The annual Life Chain prayers were held during Respect Life Month.

We enjoyed a Harvest Dinner in Fr. Rausch Hall.

We spiritually adopted recently conceived children and promised to pray a Hail Mary each day for them

for the 9 months of their gestation.

December We placed third in the annual Hancock Christmas Lights Parade. Our float was entitled King of Kings and
